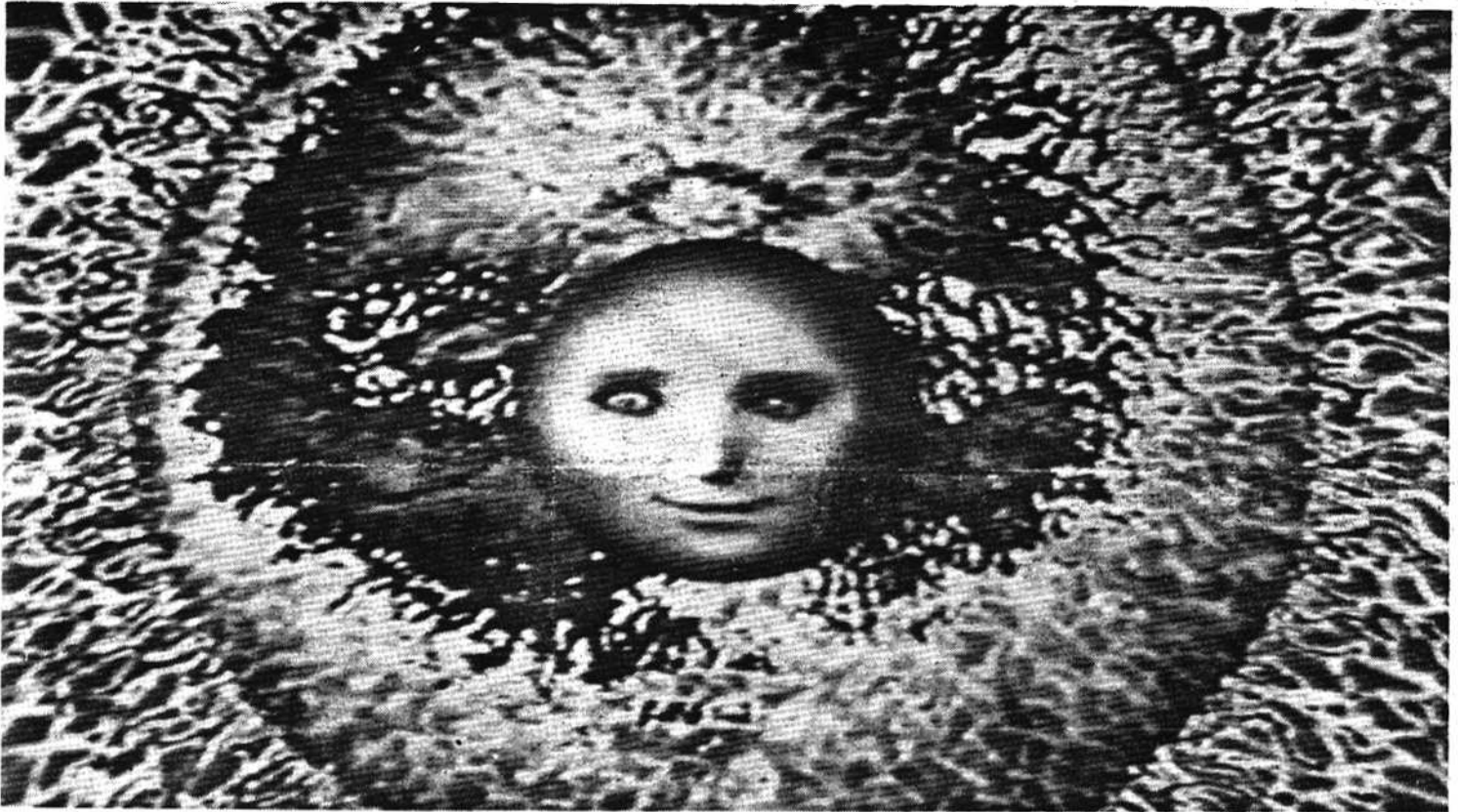

Festival shows creative video art

The seventh annual Ithaca Video Festival will be shown by the Central Art Department and Boomers restaurant of Davie from Nov. 19 through Nov. 25.

The festival is a touring exhibition, presenting a selection of independent video productions. This year it will be seen in 25 cities across the country by thousands of people in museums, galleries, libraries and schools.

Its intention is to provide an overview of the various directions and genres in the field of video art.

The 19 tapes included in this collection have been selected in a review process from among 290 submissions. Each one stands on its own for individual artistic accomplishment, creative use of the medium, inventiveness and execution. Through each the viewer is

afforded an unusual glimpse at the world through the eye and mind of the creative artist.

The Saturday presentation at Boomers restaurant will include the complete three-hour festival. During intermission between tapes, there will be experimental music by Victor Velt, dance by Leslie Neal and poetry by Jeffrey Knapp.
